Moderator's Notes...



As I write this it is the last few days of September. After several days of rain we are enjoying some lovely, sunny early fall days. The air is crisp and the trees are beginning to change. It is a lovely time of year in Michigan.

As we head into fall, one of the questions I've been asked is, "When will we return to coffee hour and other, normal Church activities?" I discussed this with our Reopening Task Team and with Executive Council. Unfortunately, the pandemic numbers in Michigan are not good – cases, hospitalizations, and (sadly) deaths have increased from their June / July lows. The Task Team recommended that we look to resume coffee hour when the test positivity rate falls below 5% (it is currently 7.8%, possibly starting to decline). So, for the time being, we will continue socially distanced worship, no coffee hour, but gathering outside after worship as you wish. Sunday School will continue to be virtual through the fall, which monthly in person, outdoor gatherings.

While we are not yet resuming indoor social and other Church activities, plans are under way for several outdoor fall activities. These are discussed below, in my Executive Council summary. The Education and Fellowship Ministry Boards are looking for **volunteers** to help organize and execute these events. Please see the sign-up sheets in the narthex, call the Church office, or contact **Michelle Sibley** or **Tim Sirovy** if you are interested in helping.

Rally Sunday was a success and a lot of fun - a big thank you to everyone who helped with this event.

Several exciting things are in the works for North Church. As reported, we will be upgrading the audio / visual equipment in our sanctuary. This will improve our ability to live stream worship and will alleviate the need for **Rev. Biedron** to juggle cameras and microphones as she is leading worship. It will also offer new possibilities for streaming future programs and events in our sanctuary. In addition, we are also in process of replacing our somewhat dilapidated sign on Twelve Mile Road with a new, electronic sign. This will make the Church's presence much more visible to passing traffic, and of course will allow us to display up-to-date messages. Both these changes will, I think, help move North Church into the future and (hopefully) help us attract new friends and members.

As I noted in my last message, in our August meeting Council also approved Church priorities for the coming year. Those priorities are:

- Complete the transition that followed Danny's retirement to our new accounting / payroll / program model (still a work in progress)
- Continue to work on developing our new Ministry Board structure, improve the ability of the Boards to solicit volunteers and form activity teams
- Finalize new bylaws (reflecting our new structure) and submit to the Congregation for approval
- Complete the transition to hybrid worship (in person plus live streamed) with improved AV equipment
- Increase the number of attendees at Sunday worship and children in Sunday School

Executive Council Notes

Executive Council met on September 27 and considered the following:



- Assets & Resources and Treasurer: Our second PPP loan was approved, the effect of the forgiveness will appear in our next financial report (kudos to everyone who made this happen). The transition to utilizing an outside firm for the Church's accounting and bookkeeping continues. There were some outside water issues around the Church with the recent heavy rains; Church office staff is addressing them. We will need a new roof for our building, probably next year. Assets & Resources is considering ways to raise funds for this.
- **Diaconate:** The Diaconate has started a new program, "Pilgrim Postal Pals." It is a way to reach out to members / friends who we have not seen in a while, or who may need a friendly word. To participate, pick up one of the addressed envelops in the narthex after worship, sign the enclosed card (with a note if you wish), and drop it in the mail. Diaconate also continues to keep in touch with our shut-ins. Fox Run has changed their shuttle policy, making it impractical for our resident members and friends. The Diaconate has arranged for volunteers to provide rides for our Fox Run attendees. If you would like to **volunteer** for Fox Run Sunday driving, please contact **Sandy Greer**.
- Education: The Education Ministry Board is planning two outdoor "trunk or treat" events for October. One will be October 9 with the Farmington Hills Police Department, in conjunction with the Faith and Blue interfaith organization. The second "trunk or treat" will be at North Church on October 31 (pray for no rain (1)). Education is also planning an adult education Bible study series in conjunction with our Senior Minister. The Board is looking for help with these events and activities; to volunteer, see the sign-up sheets in the narthex or contact Michelle Sibley.
- **Fellowship:** Fellowship is coordinating with the Education Board on the October events. In addition, they are planning a 'fowling' social event at the Hawk (you'll need to look it up) and a euchre evening in November.
- **Missions:** Our Missions Board secured several speakers for our current missions' month. They have arranged a joint workday at Camp Restore Detroit, teaming with Meadowbrook Congregational Church, on October 2. Contact the Church office if you are interested in joining us (the plan is to help with outdoor cleanup and gardening work).
- Worship: The Worship Board is looking ahead to Thanksgiving and Advent. They are coordinating with **Laurie Meeker** on music for our holiday worship. Christmas Eve will be a hybrid worship session (in person and live streamed), with the option of lighting candles at home. October 3 will be Sunday communion.

• New Business:

- Once we have the new audio / visual system installed in our sanctuary, we will need someone to run it. Church staff is looking to hire a contractor. The position description will be presented at the next Council meeting.
- o Council discussed the future of the wish list and potential capital campaigns.
- o Council meetings will continue via Zoom for the time being.

The pandemic continues to test our patience and resolve; may we continue to live and endure with faith and hope.
