

REVERSE ADVENT CALENDAR

One of the traditions many families observe during the holiday season is a countdown to December 25 via an Advent calendar. There are many variations on this tradition, from a daily chocolate treat to the daily reveal of puzzle pieces to construct a holiday scene. In all cases it is a small ritual leading to the celebration of Christmas.



Since this is the season of giving, a new reverse method of counting down the days until the 25th, a "reverse" calendar is an alternative way to celebrate the blessings of the season. It is another option for sharing the bounties we enjoy with people whose basic needs are not being met.

If you would like to do a "reverse" Advent calendar, print the calendar attached to the church bulletin, celebrate the days of December by purchasing the items during Advent. The items can be delivered to church Sunday, January 1st, at Door 2, and placed on a cart or bin in the Narthex. The Missions Board will deliver them to a community pantry.

Thanks to the North Church members and friends who have already returned Estimates of Giving for 2023; these pledges are an important to the life of the Church as we plan next year's budget.


Thanks to everyone who faithfully supports North Church and its programs with time, talent, and prayers.

Purchase the following items and place them in a basket or box each day during advent to celebrate the season by sharing our blessings. On the last day, or a date thereafter, these may be dropped off at church and they will be delivered to a community food bank the beginning of January.

- 1) Can of tuna or salmon
- 2) Can of chicken or ham
- 3) Canned soup: chicken noodle, tomato, mushroom, bean, split pea
- 4) Canned vegetables: green beans, tomatoes, corn, peas, carrots, beans
- 5) Canned fruit: pineapple, mandarin oranges, pear, peach, pie fillings
- 6) Canned meal items: beef stew, spaghetti sauce, ravioli
- 7) Boxed cereal, or oatmeal
- 8) Dried beans: navy, black, lentils, or chick peas
- 9) Bag of Rice
- 10) Box of Pasta, 1 lb.
- 11) Jar of Peanut butter, plastic bottles please
- 12) Powdered or Condensed Milk
- 13) Ground coffee or box of tea bags
- 14) Paper towels
- 15) Toilet paper or box of facial tissues
- 16) Laundry detergent
- 17) Shampoo, Suave, VO5
- 18) Bar soap
- 19) Can Opener
- 20) Toothbrush or Tooth paste
- 21) Baby Diapers size 5-6
- 22) Household cleaner or Disinfectant
- 23) Adult Incontinence products all sizes
- 24) Feminine hygiene product
