# Moderator's Notes...



It is a time of change and renewal for North Church. As mentioned in my last note, **Rev. Biedron** will be retiring at the end of this calendar year. And, as always, in May we will meet as a Congregation to elect new officers and Ministry Board members.

We have formed a Search Committee to find Mimi's successor. I've asked the current Executive Council members to serve on the Committee; we still have room for three or so additional members. This Committee will consider the Church's needs and future direction, update the position description for senior minister, launch a search (utilizing NACCC resources), review and interview candidates, and make a recommendation to Council and the Congregation. If you would be interested in serving on this Committee please let me know.

Our Nominating Committee has also started work. The Nominating Committee will be working to find candidates for the open positions. For our Ministry Boards, the open slots are:

These Boards are central to the life of the Church, directing and conducting Church activities in each of their respective areas. Membership on a Board provides direct input and influence on what our Church does and is. The time commitment is ten meeting per year (which may be via Zoom); it is important to have active members and a quorum at each of these meetings.

In addition to the Board positions the Nominating Committee will be seeking a new moderator. This is my fourth year, it has been an honor to serve, but it is time for a new face in this role.

If a member of the Nominating Committee approaches you about one of these positions, please give it careful consideration (and respond 'yes' if you can). Meanwhile, <u>if you are interested in serving on any of these Boards</u>, <u>please let me know</u>.

#### **Executive Council Notes**

Executive Council met on February 27 and considered the following:

**Assets & Resources and Treasurer**: This Board has been working with **Janice Thornton** on various building maintenance issues. They approved monies to reopen our water fountains, providing paper cups with them.

- **Diaconate:** Lenten devotional books have been popular, a second order was placed and received. There are a few still available in the narthex, please limit to one per family. The Diaconate has also ordered more of the Care Notes pamphlets, you can find them in the link. Finally, we will be assembling Easter card packets for North Church members and friends on March 12 after worship.
- **Missions:** The next North Church Crossroads mission will be in the spring, possibly in April. The Missions Board is also planning to serve at Crossroads in the summer at one of their events for children.
- Worship: The Board, after reviewing current advisories, has approved masks optional for our Choir. Easter is April 9, preparations have been made; we will also have a Maundy Thursday service with communion. Rev. Biedron has started a Lenten lecture series these are pre-recorded, you can find the first edition on the Church Facebook page.
- Communications: For Lent and Easter we are running a Facebook ad, posting seasonal messages on our Twelve Mile sign, and running a seasonal themed slide at the Civic Theater.
- **SEMACC:** Council approved North Church hosting the SE Michigan Conference to be held on Sunday, April 23, 2023.
