Moderator's Notes...

May has arrived, although winter seems to be reluctant to relax her grip. Nonetheless the signs of spring surround us. North Church celebrated Holy Week with a return of our special in-person services (with some new twists) – communion on Maundy Thursday, virtual Good Friday evening service, special music and coffee hour on Easter Sunday. It was wonderful.

Nancy and I just returned from a trip to Chattanooga. It was my first time visiting that city and I thoroughly enjoyed it. The area abounds with Civil War history (site of three major battles, national cemetery established there in 1863). Reminders of a time when Americans fought and slaughtered each other wholesale – something to recall in our divided, violent present.

On Sunday afternoon, April 23, North Church hosted the Southeastern Michigan Association of Congregational Churches. The event went very well. Thanks to all North Church volunteers who assisted with the event and the meal afterward.

The **Search Committee** survey is concluded, the Committee will summarize and share the results. Thanks to everyone who completed the survey. The Committee's next steps will be to complete the NACCC church information form and post our impending opening on the NACCC website.

The **Nominating Committee** has concluded its work (thanks to the members for their contributions). Our nominating process concludes this month at our annual program meeting. At this gathering the members will vote on accepting the nominees for the various positions. We will also hear reports from our various Boards, and consider any other business that requires member approval. This meeting will be **May 21** following worship. It will be a hybrid meeting so you may join via Zoom (although we encourage in person attendance for this meeting). We need a quorum, so mark your calendars and please plan on joining us.

You will see one change at the annual meeting. We did not have volunteers for the empty positions on the Education Board. Consequently, Executive Council has approved the combination of the Worship and Education Boards. We will try this on a temporary basis for the coming year, five Ministry Boards: Assets & Resources, Diaconate, Fellowship, Missions, and Worship & Education.

At our **May 21** annual meeting we will elect a new moderator. It has been an honor to serve you and North Church in that capacity these last four years.

Executive Council Notes

Executive Council met on April 24 and considered the following:

• Assets & Resources and Treasurer: The Church received a significant bequest gift and so is ahead of budget on revenues. Through end March pledge income is ahead of last year by 12%, expenses are about 7% lower (although our expense for natural gas heating were up

substantially). The Assets Board has been working with **Janice Thornton** on various building maintenance issues. The City will be doing work in our front parking lot, some excavation to repair an underground drainage pipe.



- **Diaconate:** Diaconate was busy with preparations for Holy Week and Easter -- Easter cards, mailed to our members and friends, Easter flower delivery to shut-ins. The Diaconate continues visitations of shut-ins and 'Pilgrim Pal' notes.
- **Fellowship**: This Board arranged the special coffee hour following Easter Sunday worship. The Board is also planning to invite all those interested to attend a concert at the Hawk on Twelve Mile on May 18. There will be lunch served after our **May 21** annual meeting.
- Missions: Sara Lange has been busy helping with Crossroads in Detroit. The Missions Board plans volunteer events at Crossroads for North Church on June 22 and July 23. We will coordinate with the Muslim Community Mosque to join us.
- Worship: The Worship Board was busy working with **Rev. Biedron** to plan Holy Week worship services. The lay reader schedule is set through July.

Other Business

- Personnel: The Personnel Committee presented a recommendation and proposed edits to the Church's vacation and sick leave policies to make them clearer. Council suggested a few edits and will take up the revised version later in an e vote.
- **Staffing:** Council approved adding a part time marketing and social media coordinator to our Church staff. We do not have anyone dedicated to this function at the moment. In addition to increasing the Church's presence on social media, this person can assist with the transition to a new minister next year.
- **Board Structure:** Council approved the trial combination of the Worship and Education Ministry Boards.

TUESDAYS WITH THE BIBLE!


