



Purchase the following items and place them in a basket or box each day during advent to celebrate the season by sharing our blessings. On the last day, or a date thereafter, these may be dropped off at church and they will be delivered to CARES the beginning of January.

- 7) Boxed cereal, or oatmeal
- 8) Dried beans: navy, black, lentils, or chick peas
- 9) Bag of Rice
- 10) Box of Pasta, 1 lb.
- 11) Jar of Peanut butter, plastic bottles please
- 12) Powdered or Condensed Milk
- 13) Ground coffee or box of tea bags
- 14) Paper towels
- 15) Toilet paper or box of facial tissues
- 16) Laundry detergent
- 17) Shampoo, Suave, VO5
- 18) Bar soap
- 19) Can Opener
- 20) Toothbrush or Tooth paste
- 21) Baby Diapers size 5-6
- 22) Household cleaner or Disinfectant
- 23) Adult Incontinence products all sizes
- 24) Feminine hygiene product
