





- 12) Powdered or Condensed Milk
- 13) Ground coffee or box of tea bags
- 14) Paper towels
- 15) Toilet paper or box of facial tissues

- 19) Can Opener
- 20) Toothbrush or Tooth paste
- 21) Baby Diapers size 5-6
